Among financing transactions in the credit market, from the Private Sector, Carlos represented Corporación Andina de Fomento (CAF), as administrative and lender, Banco de Inversión y Comercio Exterior (BICE) as lender, and Deutche Bank as collateral agent in the US\$ 52 million Eolica Koluel Kayke wind farm project finance (2013); Corporación Andina de Fomento (CAF), as lender, in a US\$ 60 million long term secured loan to Consorcio de Gestión del Puerto de Bahia Blanca, secured with income and contracts (2012); Banco Patagonia, as agent and lender, Banco Macro S.A., Banco de la Pampa S.E.M. and Banco de la Ciudad de Buenos Aires, as lenders, of a US\$ 27 million syndicated loan to Quickfood (2011); Profertil, as borrower, in the USD 70 million sindicated loan granted by Inter-American Investment Corporation (2011); Profertil as borrower from a financial loan for US\$65 million granted by the Inter-American Investment Corporation (ICC) (2009); UPS Capital Business Credit, a U.S. bank, in various financing transactions granted to Argentine companies, secured by commercial and political risk policies of the Export Import Bank of the United States (Eximbank), among other guarantees (2008-2009); the AES Group, as a sponsor in the restructuring of AES Parana project finance for US\$ 148 million (2006); YPF and Agrium, as sponsors in the project finance of Profertil for US\$300 million (2001-2002); YPF in its capacity as seller in a transaction structured abroad consistent in foreign sales and exports of crude oil to REPSOL YPF, for an approximate amount of US\$ 400 million, which would result in the advanced cash collection of the price of oil exports to be made on a regular basis during a seven-years term with advance payment of Banco Bilbao Vizcaya Argentaria and with a view to their placement in the international capital market (2001), and the advice to the Province of Cordoba in its capacity as borrower, in the granting of a syndicated loan in an amount of US\$ 150 million in the international market, guaranteed by provincial tax collection, and alternatively, a percentage of the rights of the Province on the copartnership of federal taxes (2000); and from the Public Sector, the preparation, negotiation and review of the documentation called Brady Plan, and the exchange of instruments of Par Bonds, Discount Bonds, and Floating Rate Bonds, etc.; the assignment of credits on the deferral of taxes and social security contributions entered by the National Government with a syndicate of banks (1995-1996); the subsequent operations of local and external financing in general (Medium Term Notes, Global Bond, Argentine Bond, Treasury Bills, etc., 1992-1996), the negotiation of the foreign debt of Argentina with the committee of creditor banks (1992-1993), and the operations of Argentine Eurobonds (Credit Suisse First Boston, and J.P. Morgan, (1991), among others. Among capital market operations, from the Private Sector it is worth mentioning among others, counseling services provided to Repsol YPF as only selling shareholder, in the Argentina offering of 1.9 million ADSs of its subsidiary YPF, to certain investors, settled through the Buenos Aires Stock Exchange as a block sale for a total of US\$85.3 million (2011); Repsol YPF as only selling shareholder, in the secondary public offering (IPO) of its subsidiary YPF, the sale of 26.21 million ADSs, in the international capital markets for a total of USD 1,070 million (2011); and to Repsol as bidder in the take over bid (OPA) regarding Astra shares in Argentina and Switzerland, and to YPF in Argentina and United States concerning the exchange of new shares of Repsol (2000) from the Public Sector, counseling services provided throughout the privatization process of YPF (1993), and during the national and international public offering of shares (tranches of the offer in Argentina, United States of America, Europe and Asia). He has been a member of the board (1999/2005) and statutory auditor (2008/2012) of YPF S.A., the biggest Argentine oil and gas company, and in such capacity, has been actively involved in oil and gas matters, including bio fuel projects. As for his experience in relation to public trusts, non-governmental public bodies, his appointments as an expert witness in trials in New York offered by Banco de la Nación Argentina on the trust which acted as trustee for Banco Hipotecario S.A. shares as assets in trust, and offered by the Government on the trust of Caja de Valores S.A. as trustee, and Secured Loans as assets in trust (2008); and advising to companies generating AES Group – AES Paraná S.C.A., AES Juramento S.A. and AES Alicura S.A. in their capacity as participants in the "Fondo para Inversiones Necesarias que Permiten Incrementar la Oferta de Energía Eléctrica en el Mercado Eléctrico Mayorista (Fund for investments required to increase the electric power supply in the wholesale electricity market) (FONINVEMEM)" created by the Secretaría de Energía de la Nación, and their participation in the establishment of two trusts aimed at managing each 50% of resources accumulated in the FONINVEMEM to be applied to the construction and management of the two power stations (2006), are highlights worth mentioning.
